Additionally, it is expected that all students will come prepared with notebook paper and writing utensils each week. Each student will also need to provide their own copy of the books we read. These can be purchased or checked out from the library. ISBN numbers will be listed soon. Please make sure to use the specified version of each book.								
Description								
I teach high school English on a four year cycle that includes one year each of: American Literature, World Literature, Poetry analysis and research paper writing, and "The Long and the Short of it," which is two very long novels and several short stories. 2019-2020 is the Long and Short of it year. We will be reading Les Miserables, The Three Musketeers, and several short stories by a variety of authors. The class will be heavily discussion based, as discussing themes, characters, and plot development gives the students ideas which they can then put on paper during our writing assignments. We will compare the character development of characters in a long novel versus characters in a short story. Some of our writing assignments will be based on this comparison, but we will also be learning how to write critique essays. Writing will be based on IEW methodology, but no previous IEW experience is required. The reading will be approximately 100-120 pages per week, and five paragraph essays will be due every 3-4 weeks, with longer papers due at the end of each of the long novels. There will also be one small group project during the course of the year. This is a TWO HOUR class that meets on Tuesday only.								
Homework / Expectations / Other Info								
This is a high school core class, so it is anticipated that homework will take approximately 4-5 hours per week, sometimes more. Because of the amount of work we do, this is an Honors English class. Please feel free to list it as such on your child's transcript. It is expected that all students will come to class prepared, and with an attitude ready to learn!
