Description								
<p>This course is designed to be a two semester class and a student's first systematic introduction to the sciences. The text offers a broad overview of : history of science, scientific method, designing experiments, simple machines, archaeology, geology, paleontology, biology, human anatomy and physiology. Students need to be able to print or write legibly or to type and print their answers to study guide and test weekly. Experiments are typically done twice a month, sometimes weekly. Supplies are included in the material fee. By the end of the class students should be able to complete a experiment write up without assistance (one will be assigned the end of 2nd Semester) One 2 minute presentation (simple) is required at the end of the 1st semester.</p>								
Homework / Expectations / Other Info								
<p>Students should expect 2 - 5 hours of homework a week which includes 15 - 25 pages of reading, module study guides and take home tests to be completed and returned to the teacher for grading. Labs will be written in class and graded on completion.</p>
